#### a) A message from Bishop Jo

I have had May 10<sup>th</sup> in my diary to visit the parish of Nork with Burgh Heath for so long... and am just so sorry that I cannot come and share worship and coffee with you in person that day. But I do still plan to preach and join your online worship that morning... and shall encourage Alex to fix another date that suits you in the months ahead.

I'm delighted to hear of all that you're doing despite lockdown, thanks to YouTube and Zoom and such like. Never ever – even during the persecution of the Emperor Nero! - have our churches had to remain closed for Easter. Yet it's always been true that the risen Christ is not prevented by locked doors – and through these unusual circumstances it seems that many people are seeking God. It has always been true to my own experience of life that when a door is closed, God opens a window... and certainly it seems God is at work during our pandemic in remarkable ways. I hope and pray that is true in Nork and Burgh Heath as also elsewhere in our diocese and nation. This is a time when as Christians we become distinctive for the hope we know that overcomes fear. Let's transform the government's instruction into a prayer to God: 'Stay home, protect the NHS, save lives'...

We will invite Bishop Jo to our parish on another occasion, at some point in the future, when it is possible to do so again.

#### b) A message from John Baxter

Several weeks ago now, I wrote in the parish news updates of needing to pray for John Baxter's school & all those who are involved in as they had been struggling hugely with the recent crisis. There are no back-up systems in The Gambia, as there are in the UK to help those who lose jobs or have no food to eat and not much guidance on how to manage coronavirus or the ability to socially distance.

At the last PCC meeting (back at the beginning of March) we had agreed, as part of reviewing the mission giving of the parish, that a gift of £10,000 would be allocated to the school in recognition of John's marvellous work at St. Paul's for more than two years of the interregnum before I was appointed as Vicar.

I am delighted to say that we have been able to transfer this money straight to the charity to help preserve the school's future and therefore all the children's futures (in terms of the opportunities the school offers them), as well as the staff's jobs going forward.

This money has been given from mission giving from across the parish, which had been reserved for this purpose over the last few years. During the PCC meeting in March, we also selected mission partners and other causes to receive financial gifts, from the suggestions made by those who wrote mission partner proposal forms. (Thank you all of those people! If it were not for the events which have overtaken us this year, I would have been in touch about this - and will be when the opportunity arises).

We had been going to announce the decisions at the annual APCM, which then got put on hold due to the pandemic - until September or October (I await instructions from the diocese) – and still plan to announce all of the other exciting causes we will be supporting as a parish, but I wanted to share what we have been able to do for John and the charity - and also to share his lovely message for everyone in response.

John and Dorothy are doing well - and we are keeping in touch.

This is John's message:

Alex, I have had to wait until late this morning to reply to your news of the grant from "Nork with Burgh Heath" to enable me to draw breath and make a coherent reply! We are overwhelmed by the generosity shown to our charity and to the school in The Gambia. The monies will enable us to guarantee the payment of Teachers' salaries until at least the end of the year and help to reassure Richard and all at the school that the future is secure for them at least in the short term. More important is the knowledge for them that people in the UK are thinking of them and praying for them and the people of The Gambia.

We will of course keep you up to date on the on-going situation out there which I suspect will go on a good deal longer than our own situation.

Once again, on behalf of Richard and all at the school, please pass on our thanks, our best wishes to everyone in the Parish who are all in our prayers.

Please do keep praying for John, Dorothy, Richard, the school children, their families and the school staff.
