It is very new at the moment, but we are looking forward to populating it lots in the coming weeks. Our weekly sermons from our wonderful preaching team will also be put on here (as is Alastair's from this week).

Letters are also being written, currently, to all who are not on the internet to update them on the news contained in this email.

The Parish Pastoral Care Network:

This was set up when COVID-19 first hit us - and has continued since in a reduced form once the first lock down ended. We will now return to the more intense pastoral provision we started with (though different people may be carrying out the roles according to who is able to do what at this stage). I am in the process of contacting everyone on the pastoral care network to see who is happy to continue to be shoppers (if needed), medication collectors (if needed) and phone callers (which is certainly needed), plus many additional variations on this.

The call to prayer & Prayer Booklets for everyone in the church family:

One thing the Church of England has definitely asked us to take forward into this lockdown is the call to pray- for each other, for our nation and for the world.

Thinking that another lockdown may be on the way, a while ago I obtained some prayer & bible resources for everyone in the church family - you will receive these in the next few days, to help and encourage us all in our prayers.

The (approximately) fortnightly prayer meetings via Zoom will continue as they have been since March, but with a renewed focus of praying for specific mission causes as these meetings needed a little refreshing.

The services will be at 10 am each week, except for this **Sunday (8th November)**, where we will start at 10.15 (with the link open from 10 am) to enable a silence and time of shared reflection for Remembrance Sunday at 11 am.
