a) Foodbank collection (Wednesday 23rd March, 2-4pm, at St. Paul's)

Our next Foodbank collection will be on Wednesday 23rd March, from 2-4 pm, at St. Paul's.

The items needed by the food bank this time around are: tinned fruit, ketchup, powdered milk, long-life puddings, tea bags/ coffee, sugar (500g bags please), tinned fish, washing up liquid, squash, deodorant, tampons, children's toothpaste and toothbrushes 0-2, pasta sauce, long-life fruit juice, small snack-sized chocolate (freddos, penguin bars etc), hot water bottles

Hope to see you there! Thank you for your very consistent support of this good cause.

b) Ukraine collection (Wednesday 23rd March, 2-4 pm, at St. Paul's)

Alongside our Foodbank collection this month, we will also be collecting for Ukraine and will be sending our donations via 'Surrey Stands With Ukraine'. Items which are needed are :

Medical items: bandages, wound pads, dressings, ibuprofen, paracetamol, disinfectant of all kinds, anti-burn creams and treatments, SAM splints

Search and rescue equipment: Hand torches and handheld torches, power banks 10,000 MAH+, Used smart phones (with Wi-Fi access), thermal socks in all sizes, large sized thermal tops and bottoms, thermal hats and gloves of all sizes, sturdy outdoor boots, ear protectors, dark coloured waterproof clothing and ponchos, dark coloured sleeping bags (large sizes) and ground mats

Non perishable food-stuffs: tinned food, such as soups, pulses, pasta, dried food, energy and cereal bars

Deirdre, Morna and Theresa are running 2 wonderful activities, to help us meet our Eco church targets and also to help us to raise money for charity & enjoy ourselves into the bargain.

They ask: please can we all be growing edible produce from now ready for later in the year.

This could be in gardens if we have them, or planted in small pots.

They are going to hold a plant sale on Saturday 21st May, from which the proceeds will be split between Christian Aid and A'Rocha. Please grow plants that you'd be happy to give to the parish to sell for these causes. I believe we need to be planting them NOW for them to be ready (3)

They are also asking that we grow foodstuffs to share at the parish lunch on the 31st July.

e) Operation Christmas Child

Tricia and Deirdre and others of you have received information that our 78 shoe boxes, collected for Operation Christmas Child in November 2021, seem to have gone to LIBERIA in West Africa! Some 79,301 boxes went to Liberia from the UK.

Tricia also packed two shoe boxes online and these went to Belarus.

The total number of shoe boxes collected in the UK last year was 227,350, of which 32,000 were packed online.

If you hear that a shoe box of yours was sent to another destination, please do share with Tricia or Deirdre, as we'd love to hear about it.

They say - thank you for your support and blessings. I say thank you again to both of them for organising this for us each year.

f) Some B5 updates

The Banstead Five Churches are very much hoping to re-start 'Holiday Fun' week this year, which will be on the week beginning the 25th July. They can only do this if there are enough volunteers to help look after all the children. Please take a look at the flyer attached to see if this is something you would like to support.

The Banstead Five Churches are also hoping to renew their covenant to work together, as has been the case for many years now. I have invited Neil Allison the B5 chair to come and share with us at the whole parish service on Sunday 27th March more about this.
