#### 1. Our Easter Services

At 9.00 am and 11.00 am on Sunday 17th April, we will be having Easter Communion Services at St. Paul's and St. Mary's respectively.

### 2. Our Parish Easter Egg Hunt

Everybody is welcome at our Parish Easter Egg Hunt on Saturday 16th April at 2pm, at St. Paul's (and in the Vicarage grounds and backlands).

Please do spread the word, in particular, around any children and families you know who may enjoy this fun event.

### 3. Masks and covid safety

Now that the Government has lifted legal requirements for all covid safety measures, and also now that we are coming into the springtime (and so having doors and windows open is more likely to give a better flow of air in our buildings) it is time to review our covid safety measures in our churches again.

Many of you have been very patient whilst wearing masks in church when you would not ordinarily choose to. Others of you still feel very anxious about this and would like to continue to do so.

The Church of England advice is to take the needs of all in our church family into account - and, whilst we are in line with most of the churches in our deanery currently in having continued to wear masks throughout this time - there is some variety amongst individual churches across the Diocese and the UK in how we have each chosen to approach this in recent months. Parishes are being asked to make their own choices, according to the needs of their own church families and others who may come along to our churches.

From this Sunday, we will be removing the crosses on the rows, and it will no longer be necessary to sit on every other row in church. (For those who would prefer greater social distancing, seats at the sides of both churches will be available for this). We will be keeping hand sanitising at the beginning and end of services - and will continue to have communion in one kind, as well as to share the peace without touching. All of these will be kept under review.

With regards to mask wearing, I would like to seek your opinions on this (by replying to this email) as to what your thoughts are on mask wearing in our churches is at this stage:

1. What is your preference on whether we continue to choose to wear masks for services?

2. Are there parts of the service where it is more important to be wearing masks than others?

3. Do you have any ideas about how to balance the wishes & needs of those who would very much prefer not to wear masks anymore, alongside the wishes & needs of those who would be fearful continuing to come to church if we stop yet?

4. Do you have any other suggestions which may help us to look after everyone (with all of our breadth of opinions and needs) in the continued context of covid being with us, infection rates being high, but also us needing to learn to adjust to this and move forward together

I look forward to reading your responses. Please can you reply by Wednesday next week (6th April) if you can, to give me the chance to look at what everyone has said before our services on the 10th. I will give a further update on our next steps once I've had the chance to read what you all say. Thank you for your help!
