Dear Church Family & Friends,

Hoping you're all well.

Over the summer we had some lovely activities - including another great craft morning, this time with 88 people (56 of whom were children), a summer music school for children & teenagers in the hall and some lovely meetings with members of the Scout groups also. Isaac Bone has been completing his Bronze Duke of Edinburgh Award, volunteering with myself and other church family members to help out - and a small group of young people are working towards being baptised in the next few weeks. We had some excellent food bank collections (thank you so much to everyone for your continued support with these), lovely Refresh@10 gatherings, Forest Church and Benestede ladies social events. Alongside this, we used August to engage in quite a few practical activities, which it is harder to do during the rest of the year - including the completion of Quinquennial Inspections for both churches. We have also now completed all that is needed for our Bronze Eco Church Award and so hope to officially receive this soon.

I continue to be a member of the Deanery Leadership Team and this small group of Incumbents and others have been planning some activities for 2025 & beyond which will be across the deanery, as well as in our own churches. I also recently took on chairing the local 'Banstead Five' group of churches in our area: St. Mary's & St. Paul's, All Saints, Banstead Methodist Church, Banstead URC & St. Ann's Catholic Church. Though plagued by some difficulties, this group is really pulling together and we have some lovely joint outreach events planned for the next few months and into 2025 there as well.

Last Saturday George Drewitt cycled 35 miles for 'Ride & Stride' a fundraising event for churches in England. He has raised £355 so far (thank you to everyone who has donated), which will be split half and half - between the parish and a central pool of money which will become a fund for grants for different projects which all parishes who participate can apply to.
